Before you can activate your SMU Student ID, you **must accept your admission offer** through the application portal and **submit your admission deposit**. This non-refundable deposit will be posted to your student account and will be applied to your first term tuition when it is due. By accepting your offer of admission and confirming you will attend Saint Mary's University, we can help you prepare for your arrival and communicate important dates and reminders. Your admission deposit reserves your spot at the university and allows you to activate your SMU student ID, apply for residence and register for courses when registration opens for the term.

If you are "activating" your SMU account for the first time:

- · Go to the "Activate Your Account" page at activate.smu.ca
- Enter your A-Number and PIN (your initial PIN is your date of birth in DDMMYY format)
- · Create your account password
- An s-Number and SMU email will then be displayed for your use and to access to various systems (as explained on that page)

SMU Email Address & Login Credential for email use and also to log in and access the following:

- · On-campus computers and WiFi
- Office 365: Your SMU Outlook email account, MS Office software including Word, Excel, and PowerPoint. Saint Mary's University email is used for all official communications from the Centre for Housing & Residence.
- Self-Service Banner: used for **course registration**, **viewing your tuition/fees** (account summary by term), final grades, tax forms, and much more. Go to smu.ca, Click "Quick Links" from top right corner, Select "Self-Service Banner"


- SMUPORT: used to access Brightspace (Learning Management System) from within SMUPORT
- · Where you apply for residence via the Residence Portal
- Access course content, announcements, and current grades
- · SMUSA health/dental plan (SMUSA Health Waiver)

Residence: Your second home

What better way to immerse yourself in the Saint Mary's community than living on campus? Living in residence connects you to university life and is a great way to gain new experiences and meet friends. Our student housing is connected to the rest of campus, meaning students don't even need to go outside to get to their classes! Students can choose between various housing options including single, double and apartment-style rooms. Applications for residence open as early as February 1, but note that space is limited and we strongly encourage you to apply early. Your residence deposit is due by May 15. Applications for residence are still considered as space allows after May 15. For more information on housing options, please visit smu.ca/residence.

If you are interested in living on campus, please complete the following steps:

- 1. Log in to SMUport (http://smuport.smu.ca/) using your s-Number and click the "Residence" tab.
- **2**. The Residence Portal is where you can pay your \$25 residence application fee, create a student profile, and select your residence room preferences.
- 3. Once your application has been completed, you will receive an email from the Centre for Housing & Residence Life with a Residence Agreement (contract).
- **4.** Return the completed Residence Agreement and pay the confirmation deposit by May 15 to ensure that your residence bed space is reserved.

Meal Plans are mandatory for students who live in Loyola and Vanier. Students living in Rice are only required to have a modified minimum meal plan. All students who are confirmed in our residences are defaulted to the All Access meal plan, which provides unlimited access to the Dockside Dining Hall. Students who would like to change their meal plan are able to do it up until the date when semester fees are due.





Register for your classes

Before you can register for your classes, you must accept your offer of admission and submit your deposit through the application portal at https://smuca.elluciancrmrecruit.com/Apply/Account/Login.

Your admission deposit reserves your spot at the university and allows you to register for courses when registration opens for the term.

When you register for courses, you hold a seat in each class. Please be aware your courses have a financial and academic component and Saint Mary's University has set withdrawal dates and payment due dates. We require students to complete their registration and pay their tuition and fees before the deadline.


- Go to www.smu.ca, click "Quick Links" from top right corner, Select "Self-Service Banner"
- · Click "Enter Secure Area"
- Enter your Saint Mary's email and password
- Search and register for your classes

Money Matters

Entrance Scholarships

Students who apply for admission to Saint Mary's University by March 1 will automatically be considered for entrance scholarships. The Scholarship Application and Bursary committee will review all applications after March 1 and will strive to let successful recipients know by early April.

Admission Awards

Apply online for Presidential, International Baccalaureate Presidential, Santamarian, Sobey Innovator Scholarships for Bachelor of Commerce Students, and additional scholarships by **March 1**. Visit smu.ca/scholarships for more information.

Tuition and Related Student Fees

Tuition is determined on a course-by-course basis. Find your tuition cost by going to smu.ca/calculator. You can pay tuition online through Self-Service Banner using our Interac Online process. Check the website for payment due dates and the deadline to add and drop courses.

Students who have adequate health coverage in Canada can opt out of the Saint Mary's University Student Association's (SMUSA) health coverage in SMUport with appropriate documentation. See studentvip.ca/smusa for more information.

Student Loans

Student loans are available to Canadian students at the federal and provincial levels. The application process takes time, so apply through your province of residence as early as May or June.

International students should check with local government and banking contacts. Students from the United States can use U.S. student loans at Saint Mary's University.

Residence Move-in

Your first week on campus is a very exciting time! If you have chosen to live in residence, your first step will be to move into your residence room and meet your new floor mates. More information regarding the move-in process will be communicated to you once you reserve your room in residence (by paying your residence confirmation deposit and submitting your signed Residence Agreement through the residence portal).

Welcome Weeks

One of the best ways to start your university experience is by participating in Welcome Weeks. Welcome Weeks are led by students and staff who are passionate about Saint Mary's and want to ensure that your experience as you arrive on campus is the best that it can be.

Service Expo

One of the first places you'll want to visit when you arrive on campus will be the Service Expo. This is where you can pick up your Student ID card, your Halifax Transit U-Pass (bus pass), and your SMUfit membership to the Homburg Centre for Health and Wellness (our gym).

Bookstore

You'll also want to visit the bookstore when you arrive. Be sure to bring a list of your classes so you can pick out the right books for your course. Please note, eBooks are also available online, along with Saint Mary's University gear, at bookstore.smu.ca.

Centre for New Students (CNS)

Located in the McNally building lobby, the CNS is a great resource for new students who need help navigating Self-Service Banner for registration. They can also provide campus tours and program information. To book a campus tour, please visit smu.ca/campustours.

Service Centre

Located in the McNally building in room MM108, the Service Centre is your first stop for general inquiries.
